Clean out your closets and other storage areas for the big Community-wide Yard Sale.

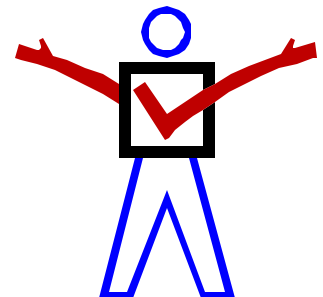
Annual Meeting October 16th

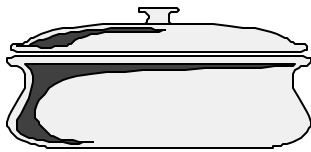
Attention Gardeners and Cooks! PLANT SWAP/ POT LUCK OCTOBER 13TH

We have invited the owner of Greenview Gardens (on Liberty Road across from our entrance) to answer questions about landscaping, winterizing, etc.

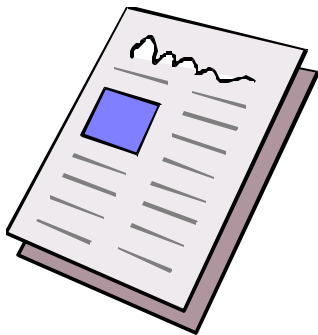

Apple Fritters

With apples ripening on the trees, why not try this recipe for Apple Fritters? You can use other fruits if you like. .

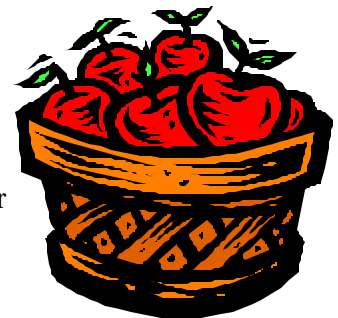
Fruit Fritter Batter

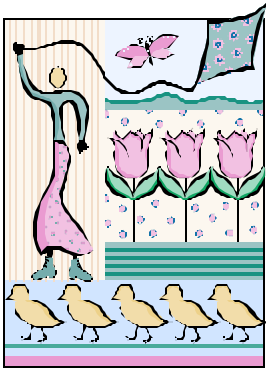
- 1 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs well beaten

- 2/3 cup milk

Mix the flour, sugar, and salt. Add milk slowly and then gradually add the eggs.

Cut fruit in pieces, dip in the fruit fritter batter above and fry in deep hot (375 degrees F.) fat or butter about 3-5 minutes or until a golden brown. Then remove with a skimmer, and place on crumpled soft paper to drain. Sprinkle with powdered sugar .

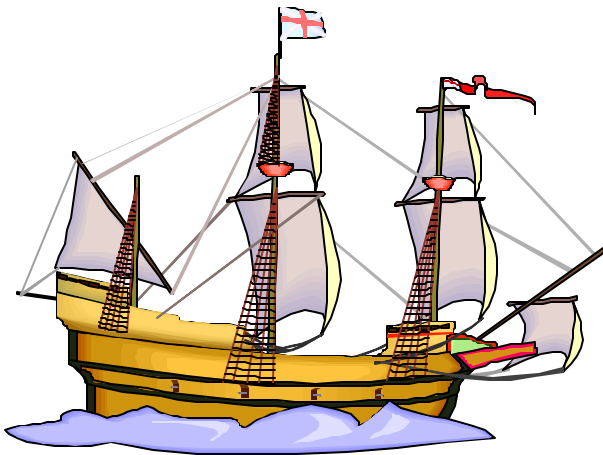
