Annual Meeting Held October 16th

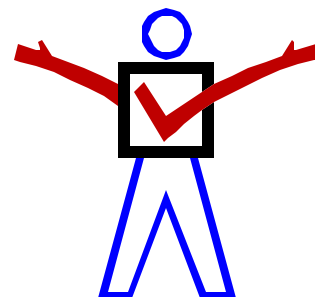

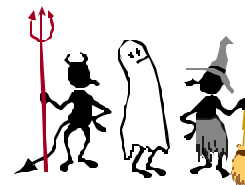
Halloween Parade and Party October 27th

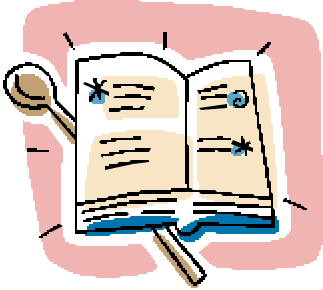

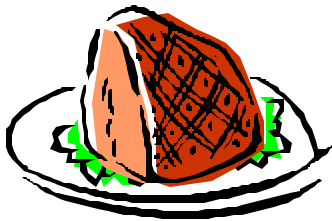
The day was beautiful and sunny. The temperature was perfect for yard-sales as evidenced by all the residents who

Easy Omelets

Would you like a recipe for omelets that is easy and quick to make and has practically no clean up? This recipe comes from the Boy Scouts at Moriah Methodist Church.

You will need

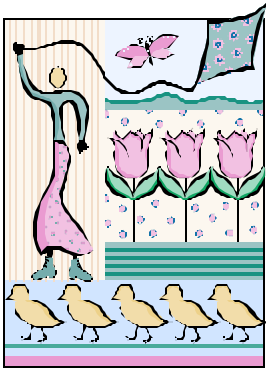
- Eggs
- Plastic zip-loc bags
- Cheese, chopped ham, bacon, green peppers, onions, or whatever else you like to spice up an omelet.



Start by boiling water in a large deep pan.

Open a zip-loc bag and put two eggs in the bag. Hold the bag carefully with the zipper on top and squish the eggs until they are "beaten." Add your other ingredients and mix them with the same method. Zip the bag and drop it in boiling water. You can cook several at once, depending on the size of your pan.

Cook until the egg is well done. Remove the omelet from the bag (it is hot so please use caution). "Dump" the omelet on a plate and enjoy.

Of approximately 230 households in Lynwood Lakes, less than half are members.

The largest single source of revenue, membership dues this year have resulted in income of \$17,000. Projected expenses are \$20,000.

Some expenses so far this year have been:

- ◆ \$7050.00 for mowing and grounds maintenance.

- ◆ \$250.00 for copying and mailing the newsletter
- ◆ \$925.00 for electricity (lights at the entrance and swim area and other common areas).

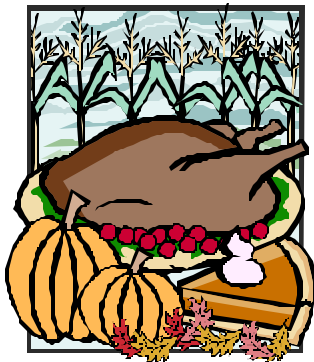

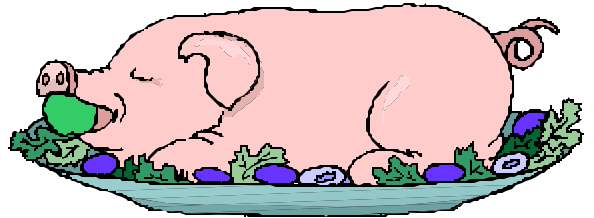
