Free food will be provided from 11:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. Two hot dogs per person, chips, drink, and a dessert will be served.

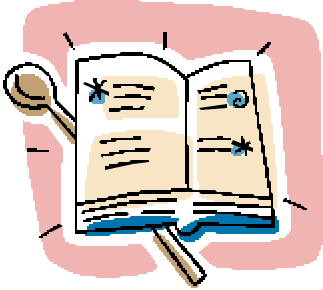
Various local agencies and businesses will be participating from 1:00 P.M. until approximately 3:00 P.M.

We are looking for recipes for appetizers, beverages, soups, salads, main entrees, casse-

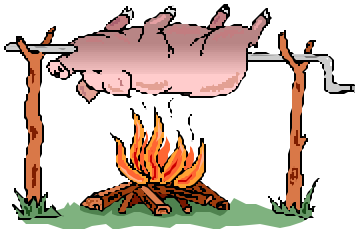
roles, sides, desserts, pies, cakes, candy, cookies, muffins, biscuits, breads, etc. Recipes should include preparation time and number served.

Easy Egg Casserole

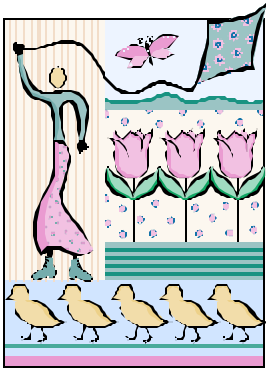
You can sleep a little later in the morning when you bake this because you make it ahead the night before.

- One pound sausage (cooked, drained and crumbled)
- 4 cups cubed day old bread
- 2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 10 eggs, slightly beaten
- 4 cups of milk



- 1 tsp dry mustard, 1 tsp salt, ground pepper to taste
- Optional 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms or 1/2 cup peeled, chopped tomatoes.

Place bread in well buttered 9X13" baking dish. Sprinkle with cheese. Combine the next 6 ingredients and pour evenly in the pan. Sprinkle sausage and optional ingredients over the top. Cover and chill overnight. Bake in preheated oven uncovered at 350 degrees for one hour. Serves 6.
