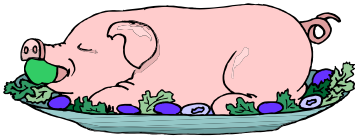

Rules of the Shelter



Did you want to use the shelter but weren't sure of the do's and don'ts? You want the shelter clean but don't know who to call?

Well, this time, don't call anyone. Cleaning the shelter before and after you use it is your responsibility. You will need to provide your own cleaning supplies.

The large dumpster is gone but there are garbage cans in the shelter closet that you can use to collect trash while you are using the shelter.

Plan to bring your own garbage bags and to remove them and any trash after your use of the shelter.

The combination for the gate lock will also open the lock on the closet. You will be able to turn on water and power from the closet. Be sure to turn them off before you leave.

Be sure to pick up any litter. Think of the area around the shelter as if it were your own backyard and take care of it.

Neighborhood Watch Signs Are In

Your neighborhood watch group is still at work. The larger neighborhood signs are in and so are the individual signs for display at your residence.

The group is in need of a new Watch Captain. David Neal did a great job getting this started and rolling. However, he no longer has the time to serve as Captain.

Ice Cream Salad

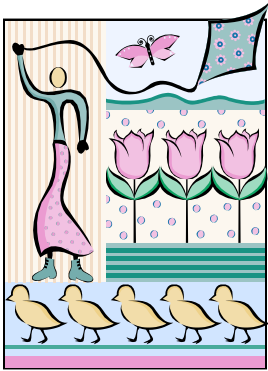
- 1 (3 ounce) package of orange Jell-O plus 1 cup boiling water



- 1 pint vanilla ice cream, softened
- 1/2 cup pecans, chopped
- 1 (8 ounce) can crushed pineapple, drained

Dissolve Jell-O in boiling water. Mix in remaining ingredients and place in serving dish. Refrigerate until set. Serve with whipped cream and the kids will think it is a dessert.

No shark sightings have been reported in Lynwood Lakes but there are dangers lurking in the waters.

Did you know for instance that Coast Guard safety rules and regulations for inland watercraft apply to the watercraft on Lynwood Lake? Lynco has some of its own rules for safety on our lake. Boats and skiers should keep to the right of the lake, no closer than 25 feet from shore. Boats towing skiers, tubers, knee boarders, etc should have at least two people in the vessel: a driver and a spotter.

Follow these simple, common-sense rules and we will all have a happy and safe summer.... free of shark bites.
