Swimming, balloon tosses, tugs of war, and three legged races are just some of the fun activities. You might even see a skateboard demonstration by some of our brave, talented young men.

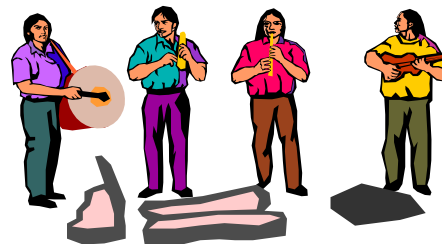
The Ladies of the Lakes will also be holding a raffle for some great prizes. Please help support Lynco by purchasing a raffle ticket, or two, or three or ...!

## Summer is Here, So Please Remember The Lake Rules

We all need a reminder from time to time. So here's a few reminders on our Lake rules. All watercraft on either lake must be owned by a Lynco member and registered with Lynco. (contact Bill Jones at 674-8533 for registration). Outboard motors are limited to 90 horsepower and regular boats can be no longer than 17 feet.

Also, remember than maximum speed is 7.5 MPH (no wake) prior to noon on all days of the week. Please be thoughtful of others who take advantage of sleeping in late. Always run your watercraft in a counter-clockwise direction. Last, but certainly not least, always wear your lifejacket!

## Update on the Little Lake's Dam Repairs!

As mentioned in the last newsletter, the little lake's dam has been declared a High Risk dam by the State of NC. This means that very expensive work needs to be done to it. So far, the engineering services have cost Lynco over \$7,000 and the repairs still have to be done. Sorry to say, but it will be necessary to drain the little lake. There will be attempts to catch as many fish as possible and transfer them to the big lake. To

keep costs down, most of the work will be done by community members. Repairs are scheduled for sometime in the fall. A work party sign will be posted in advance. Please donate a little time and muscle to help with this project. Who knows, you might even have some fun!

## Fundraiser to Help With Repair Costs

In the last newsletter, we asked the community for ideas on how to raise money for the repairs to the Little Lake so that we wouldn't have to spend a substantial amount of Lynco Community money. Well, thank you for your responses. A fundraiser raffle seems to be the best solution.

First prize will be \$2,500, second prize will be \$1,500 and third prize will be \$1000. Ticket donation will be \$50 each. We will issue no more than 300 tickets, so your chances of winning are

1 in 100! Much better odds than the typical drawing! The winning tickets will be drawn Saturday, September 18th at 1:00 P.M. at the swim area. You do NOT need to be present to win.

## Watering Restrictions—Please Observe Them

We are concerned that the summer is starting off with dry conditions.

There were new rules adopted last October at the general meeting for homes that use water from the lakes to operate irrigation systems. These new rules are:

1. If the lake level falls 6", you may water **ONLY** once a week.
2. If the lake level falls 12" or more, **NO** watering is allowed.
3. Hand watering will be allowed at all times for flowers and vegetable gardens

All homes that have a yard irrigation system that uses the lake **MUST** contact Bill Jones at 674-8533 and give him your phone number and address.

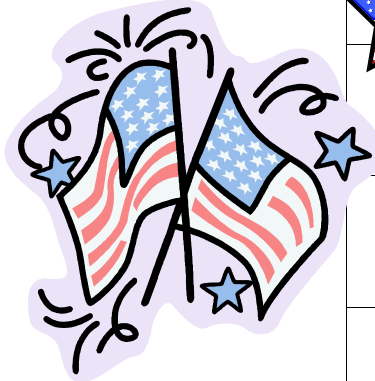
Bill will be happy to notify you of the lakes' status.

There does not appear to be any easy solution to this problem and no one wants to offend anyone. There is no doubt that pumping from the lakes brings the water levels down.

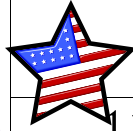
Whether you agree with this or not, we have to do something to protect our lakes. Restrictions on irrigation systems have to be established and homeowners be advised before new systems are installed.

Please remember that our lakes are recreational lakes, not irrigation lakes. If you are unable to follow these rules, Lynco can and will disconnect your pump from the lake.
